





The Most Successful Young Entrant is an initiative of the 2004 Queensland Young Ambassador for the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Show Societies, Sean Dillon. The current perpetual trophy has been donated by the 2022 QCAS Queensland Rural Ambassador, Cassandra Wortmann. Cass (2022) and Sean (2004), and Harrison Lehmann (2023) all represented Alpha Show Society and went on to win at Central Highlands and Queensland judging. The idea is to promote the several different facets, that complete the overall image of a rural Agricultural Show and to encourage participation in as many different areas of the show as possible.

Requirement for entry:

- The entrant must be aged under 25 years, on the Wednesday of the Alpha Show; and
- Must compete in two (2) different sections of the show.
- NB: Entering horses in the led ring and the hack ring does not by itself allow eligibility. However, Hack/Led Ring and Show Jumping, would be acceptable. Pavilion classes will be considered as one section for the purpose of this award.

Scoring Guidelines:

- 1. Nominations must be received in writing to the Show Secretary prior to the show.
- 2. Depending on nominations entrants may be requested to provide a list of their show achievements.
- 3. If this is required, the secretary will tally the results using the points system below:

w 9 points - Supreme Champion; w 8 points
- Grand Champion; w 7 points - Champion;
w 5 points - Reserve Champion; w 3 points
- First; w 2 points - Second; w 1 point Third

4. Protests must be lodged in writing within 30 minutes of the decision being announced, at which case a committee consisting of the A.S.S. President, one Vice President and a Chief Steward, will consider the protest and determine a finding. This finding will be absolute and final.

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


A variety of meals will be on offer. Monday night 20/5/24 a BBQ, 21st & 22nd includes breakfast, lunch, snacks & night time meals.



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

Horse Ring

Regulations

Entries: Ticketing System

Nomination Fee: \$2 unless otherwise stated.

- 1. Alpha Show Society is bound by the Rule, by Laws & Regulations of the QCAS Special Horse Regulations V6, unless otherwise stated below.
- 2. Horse Health Declaration & Indemnity Form must be completed & Stall & Electric Fence fees & any ONLINE NOMINATIONS must be paid before competing.
- 3. Stall bookings \$15 per stall, electric fences can be erected on the western side of the paddock fence off the camping area. \$20 per fenced area. Payment must be made before competing.

- 4. All riders competing in events at the Alpha Show, must wear protective head gear to the current Australian Standard, including costume class (unless otherwise stated in the Schedule for the class),
- 5. Competitors must be correctly attired in all classes., as per QCAS Special Horse Regulations V6, Section This includes, short boots for all junior rider classes.
- 6. Ponies 14hh & under, may be led by an adult or child, but not ridden by an adult unless otherwise stated
- 7. No stallions shall compete in Hack events or riding events unless otherwise stated. Stallions, must be lead by person 18 years and over.
- 8. Children's age will be taken as the 1st day the show. Birth Certificate must be available for inspection on request by stewards. No exceptions.
- 9 Lady or Gentleman rider means the rider must be 18 years old by the first day of the Show.
- 10. Riders in the Open Hack Ring (Ring 1) must be 12 years and over (unless otherwise stated).
- 11. A Junior Rider 12 years and over competing in Ring 1, can also compete in Ring 2 where stated on a Galloway or Hack. Neither Ring will be held up for any competitor competing in both rings.
- 12. Mounts ridden in Ring 1 by Senior Riders, 18 years and over, may not be ridden in Ring 2 by a Junior Rider under 18 years. Mounts ridden in Ring 2 by a Junior Rider, may not be ridden by a Senior Rider in Ring 1.
- 13. A novice horse is one that has never won a Championship ribbon at any Agricultural Show at the close of nominations.
- 14. A maiden horse = never won a blue ribbon at any Ag. Show at the close of nominations, & must be ridden in a snaffle bridle.
- 15. Competitors nominated in 2 rings where times clash, must choose which event they compete in. With the exception of Championships, events will not be held up for late riders under any circumstances.
- 16. Lodgement of a completed horse health form will be taken as a guarantee that the animals specified therein are free from all disease as far as is known by the owner and/or exhibitor. In the case of an infectious disease being spread through or by an exhibit, the exhibitor shall be held responsible.
- 17. The Alpha Show Society will not be responsible for any accident, that may be caused through or by an exhibitor, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold Alpha Show Society Inc. blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident.
- 18. Alpha Show Society Inc., will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accident on the ground.

Departure

Horses moving across the Tick line of Alpha need to adhere to the Department of Agricultural & Fisheries guidelines on moving low risk tick carriers within QLD These procedures are available in the Queensland Biosecurity Manual on the Department of Agriculture & Fisheries website (www.daf.qld.gov.au)

Conditions

- 19. Protests must be lodged in writing to the Secretary within one (1) hour after the awarding dispute has been made. A protest fee of \$50 is required & will be retained by the Society, if in the opinion of the executive the protest is frivolous.
- 20. Stock, where practicable, shall be paraded as directed by the Ring Master. Exhibitor's who do not comply, may be fined & disqualified at the discretion of the Ring Master, whose decision will be final. All prizes won by said exhibitor shall be retained by the Society.
- 21. The age of all horses are to be calculated as from 1st August. Every horse foaled before 1st August in any year shall be deemed to be one year old on that date.
- 22. Any animal which, in the opinion of the Stewards is not in a fit state to be exhibited, may be rejected by them & debarred from competing in the class or classes for which it is entered.
- 23. All horses entered for competition in stud classes, must be **registered** in a stud book of their respective breed society recognised by the Royal National Association. Registration papers (or copies) must be produced upon request where breed regulations require, nominations must be accompanied by breeding details.
- 24. The committee reserves the right to add classes as deemed necessary to cater for unexpected interest in particular breed classes.

Measuring

25. Measuring of horses, galloways & ponies is available on request. Official EFAQ Measuring Card/ Show Horse Committee Queensland Cards will be accepted. An allowance of 3/8" is made for shoes.

Measuring Cards issued at the Alpha Show will be the only ones recognised at this & all shows on the Central Highlands circuit. Entry into either ring may be denied without a height card.

26. Ponies are not to exceed 14hh. (Except Registered Australian Saddle Ponies & Registered Riding Ponies who are not to exceed 14.2hh). Galloways over 14hh not exceeding 15hh.

Judging

- 27. If there are sufficient numbers for competition, at the Judges discretion horses may be split into separate classes.
- 28. No person except those engaged in charge of the exhibit shall be permitted to remain in the yards or ring during judging.
- 29. Stock appearing in the ring for judging will be disqualified, if decorated with medals, ribbons, or prize tickets awarded at previous shows or events.
- 30. All Champion Led Horses from Rings 1 & 2 will compete for Supreme Led Exhibit.
- 31. Where there is more than one Breed, Grand Champion for each exhibit, points will not be accumulated for Aggregate Trophies. Otherwise points for Aggregate trophies are calculated as follows:

9 points - Supreme Champion, 7 points - Champion, 5 points - Reserve Champion, 3 points - First, 2 points - Second, 1 point - Third

In the event of a tie for any place, the points awarded for the place & the next lower place shall be equally divided. \n

32. The Judge may at their discretion, refuse to award a prize where an exhibit is in the opinion, not of sufficient merit.

District Hack Conditions

33. Residential conditions for district hack events are that competitors in the district hack classes in Ring 1 & Ring 2, must be resident within the boundaries of the old Jericho Shire for at least the previous six (6) months.

- 1. Single Entry Nomination Fee: \$17 per head, which includes initial bedding. Group Entries Nomination Fee: \$6 per group, which includes initial bedding. Led Steer/Heifer: \$11 per class. Herd Bulls: \$5 per class. Fees must be paid in full prior to judging otherwise exhibits will be disqualified.
- 2. Lodging of completed entry forms is taken as a guarantee by the owner, that the animals specified therein are free from all disease. In the case of an infectious disease being spread through or by an exhibit, the exhibitor shall be held responsible.
- 3. The Alpha Show Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibitor, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold Alpha Show Society harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident.
- 4. Alpha Show Society will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accident on the ground, sale yards or premises.
- 5. Precautions will be taken to guard against fire and to protect the property at the Show, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Alpha Show Society.
- 6. Stock, where practicable, shall be paraded as directed by the Chief Steward. Exhibitor's who do not comply, may be fined and disqualified at the discretion of the Chief Steward, whose decision will be final. All prizes won by said exhibitors shall be retained by the Society.
- 7. Cattle must be tied with neck chains when left unattended and must have nose clips when paraded. Failure to comply will result in fines at the discretion of the Stewards.
- 8. Positive evidence of infertility will be adequate for disqualification.
- 9. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor, to ensure that animals in the stud and led steer section which are brought onto the grounds, are tractable and able to be restrained and handled without causing damage.
- 10. The use of hormones and/or tranquillisers is prohibited. Any exhibitor violating this regulation will be dealt with by the Committee.
- 11. ALL CATTLE TO BE EXHIBITED AS TICK FREE.
- 12. All cattle entered in stud cattle classes must be registered in the name of the exhibitor as owner in a properly constituted herd book of the relevant breed association and must comply with the rules and regulations of the relevant breed association.
- 13. Age of all stud cattle shall be the actual age as at 1st April. Actual date of birth of each animal must be entered on the entry form.

- 18. Competitors arriving more than 1 day prior to Show, or departing more than 1 day later must obtain permission from the Secretary, so that arrangements can be made. Charges may apply.
